You have previously been given a copy of the Notice of Administrative Charges and Report of Investigation with Exhibits. The Commission is scheduled to hold a hearing on the allegations to determine if actual violations occurred, and assess penalties. The Commission may also determine if it wishes to accept a Stipulation (informal settlement) by the parties as to facts, violations and/or penalties, if such a Stipulation is proposed by the parties. See WAC 390-37-090.

If you do not plan to be present at the hearing, you may submit evidence in your own behalf or in mitigation no later than noon on Thursday, September 18, 2014 for review by Commission members.
